We have been continuing our letter writing unit in English, as well as carrying on expanding our love of reading. The class have been participating in 5 minute reading challenges, where they have been seeing how many pages they can read out loud in 5 minutes.

Another way we have looked at taking a break is den building which can help us to feel safe and secure

It's been a great half term spent getting to know our new students better and building positive working relationships with them. One of the ways in which we have done this is to make mindfulness bracelets together which are not only helpful to remember to hold each other in mind but can also be used as something to fidget with or focus on counting if things get a little tricky.
