Maths

In Maths this term we will be focusing on 2D and 3D shapes.

We will look at symmetry, recognizing and classifying triangles and quadrilaterals from their properties, finding the area of triangles and trapeziums, finding unknown angles and much more.



Literacy

Writing:

Our text this term is 'Animalium'. Our end of unit writing will be a non-chronological report based on an animal we find particularly interesting.

We'll look at the features of non-chronological reports & incorporate these in our writing. We'll eventually create our own reports and collate these into a class book.

Reading:

We'll develop our prediction, inference, summarizing & questioning skills as well as comparing and contrasting this text, about a boy and his pet fox, with others we've read.

Our reading text is:

'Pax'

Food Prep & Nutrition

Roman or World War 1 Food?

Experimenting with food from these two periods (in line with our Project Based Learning), foods such as opulent Roman dishes and the pre-rationing recipes that poorer families ate during World War 1.



R.E.

We'll continue to learn about 'What it means to be a Muslim in Britain today.'

We'll learn to recognise and identify words such as Allah, Shahadah and Qur'an and give simple definitions of these words. We'll make links and note the diversity of different communities within Islam and give two examples of things Muslims do to worship God. and give an example of what it means for a Muslim to submit to God.

PSHE / RSE

This term we'll focus on the topics of changing and growing and managing feelings.

Within this we will complete our Relationships and Sex Education unit this term.

Physical Education

Multi Skills, including: supporting students to experience a variety of sports ball sports (basketball, dodgeball etc), tennis, fitness, gymnastics and orienteering.

Lifeskills / Preparing for Adulthood

This term we are focusing on budgeting.

We will look at money management, monthly expenditure and how to set a budget so we can afford to pay for things or to save for items we want.

Forest School

Whittling skills, campfire cooking, fire lighting and safety, team building.

Project Based Learning

Our question is:

Would you rather be a Roman or WW1 soldier and why?

As Historians we will:

- Study the development of transport, trade, and conflict throughout British history
- Study WWI in depth
